Deepening Disciples

Our first key question as a Diocese is: How are you growing, and enabling others to grow in the depth of their discipleship?

A Prayer of Benedict of Nursia

Gracious and holy Father, please give me intellect to understand you, reason to discern you, diligence to seek you, wisdom to find you, a spirit to know you, a heart to meditate upon you, ears to hear you, eyes to see you, a tongue to proclaim you, a way of life pleasing to you, patience to wait for you, and perseverance to look for you. Growing Disciples

Our second key question as a Diocese is: How are you enabling growth in the numbers of disciples of Jesus?

Collects
